About PHLpreK

PHLpreK is the City of Philadelphia's initiative aiming to make affordable, quality pre-K available for 6,500 three- and four-year-olds by 2020. To achieve this, the Mayor's Office of Education is partnering with early childhood education providers to improve access to pre-K, especially in high-need areas. The program provides vital school readiness for children, and also creates living wage jobs in pre-K centers across the city – mostly small, women- and minority-owned businesses.

We expect more job growth in early education in the coming years as the program expands to include more seats, and are building training and education pipelines to recruit new professionals into the field.
